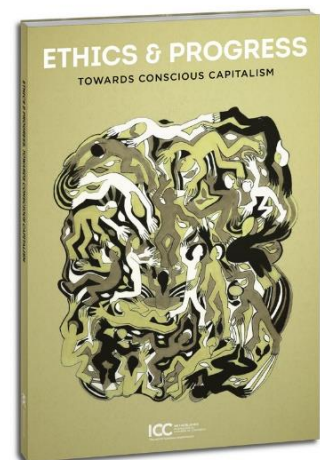

Mr. Henk W. Broeders

Henk Broeders has been Chair of ICC Netherlands since 2011. From 2008 until 2012 he was Chairman of the Board of Capgemini the Netherlands and member of the Group Executive Committee of Capgemini S.A., after a career in computer technology that started at Dow Chemicals. Henk Broeders holds a number of Supervisory board positions including Chairman of the Supervisory Board at Mazars Accountants.

Prof. Robert H. Wade

Professor of Political Economy and Development, London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE)

Robert Wade is a Professor of Global Political Economy at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). He was awarded the Leontief Prize for Advancing the Frontiers of Economic Thought in 2008 and in 1992 the American Political Science Association's ‘Best Book in Political Economy, 1989-91’, for *Governing the Market: Economic Theory and the Role of Government in East Asia's Industrialization*. He worked earlier at the Institute of Development Studies, the World Bank, US Congress, Princeton University, MIT and Brown University.

Mr. Nicola Bonucci

Nicola Bonucci is Managing Director of the Global Trade and Investigations and White Collar Defense practices at Paul Hastings since 2019. Previously, Mr. Bonucci served as the Director for Legal Affairs for the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD). He joined the OECD in 1993 as a legal adviser and then became a director in 2005. He has been one of the most prominent international voices in anti-corruption and anti-bribery.

Mirjam Bakker is responsible for the bank-wide compliance management and -organisation, directly in support of the bank's Executive Board and ABN AMRO's purpose, Banking for better, for generations to come. Before joining ABN AMRO, she served as Group Risk & Compliance Director at SBM Offshore NV, as Global Head of Compliance at Aegon NV and before that she had corporate counsel positions at Aegon, ABB and Tata Steel.

Ms. Dubois has played a leading role in international anti-corruption efforts for two decades. She retired as the Integrity VP of the World Bank at the end of 2019, after having served as the first Chief Suspension and Debarment Officer. She is a member of the Board of Governors of the Washington Foreign Law Society, received the 2016 Lifetime Achievement Award for Services to the Compliance Industry, Women in Compliance Awards and was named one of Ethisphere Magazine's '100 Most Influential People in Business Ethics for 2007'. She has been teaching a course on international anti-corruption as an Adjunct Professor at Georgetown Law since 2009 and, as of 2020, works as an independent international executive advisor.

Marijke Wolfs is responsible for the Netherlands chapter of the International Chamber of Commerce.
